----- GENERAL RULES -----

1. Exhibitor must be an active Okeechobee 4-H or FFA member *in good standing* enrolled by October 31, 2026.
-  2. Exhibitor must be currently enrolled in the Okeechobee County School District or live in Okeechobee County and, upon request, be able to provide satisfactory proof of enrollment in another school district.
-  3. **ALL email correspondence submitted to OYLS at okeechobeeyls@gmail.com must include exhibitor's name and submission type in the subject line (i.e., Jane Doe – market swine picture, John Doe – dairy lease papers). All forms and registrations papers must be submitted in .pdf format.**
-  4. Exhibitors in 6th grade through 12th grade must have a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) to participate in the March show. **Exhibitors must submit their 2 nine weeks/1st semester report card** to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com in .pdf format no later than February 1st. Home schooled exhibitors must provide their most current evaluation. Failing to email your report card or evaluation will result in a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fine if it is received after February 1st but no later than February 15th.
5. Physical conditions of exhibitor which the OYLS show committee considers to be a health and safety problem in the show or sale may result in the OYLS show committee not accepting an entry or allowing the entrant to participate in the show or sale.
6. Exhibitor must be at least eight (8) years old by September 1, 2026. Participants (Cloverbuds) that are ages five (5) to seven (7) as of September 1, 2026, will only be permitted to show poultry and rabbits.
7. The Okeechobee Youth Livestock Show Committee believes that every youth exhibitor should receive proper training information for raising and showing a youth animal project. It is important that the exhibitor understand the purpose and importance of ethics in youth livestock projects, proper animal handling and management, and the difference between animal welfare and animal rights. The mandatory Youth Livestock Show Ethics and Animal Care Workshop is designed to meet these requirements. Every youth exhibitor is required to attend a workshop and obtain certification no later than January 15th. Certification is valid for 3 fair seasons. This program has been endorsed by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the University of Florida, IFAS. Dates, times, and locations of workshops will be available from 4-H Club Leaders, FFA Advisors, and the Florida State Fair website (www.floridastatefairag.com) after they have been scheduled.
8. OYLS recognizes that it is a privilege to participate in the livestock show and sale, and that bullying activities and illegal substance use are detrimental to the education provided by participation in 4-H or FFA activities. By entering an exhibit in the OYLS, the exhibitor acknowledges that if they are found to participate in bullying activities or illegal substance use, their entry may be disqualified at any time at the discretion of the OYLS board of directors.
9. All entry forms must be completed and submitted online. Follow the link located at www.okeechobeeyouthlivestockshow.com, under rules and information. Entries will remain pending until verified by 4-H Leaders and FFA Advisors.
 -  a. **Market steer** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, September 9, 2026, at 5:00 pm. The Okeechobee County market steer/heifer

affidavit located at the end of the rulebook must be submitted via email in **.pdf format** to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com on or before the entry form deadline. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**

- b. **Market swine** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, November 25, 2026, at 5:00 pm. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**
- c. **Goat and lamb** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, November 25, 2026, at 5:00 pm. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!** (*see General Rule #11 regarding administrative fee)
- d. **Beef breeding** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, January 6, 2027, at 5:00 PM. The Okeechobee County Market Steer/Heifer affidavit located at the end of the rulebook must be submitted via email in **.pdf format** to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com on or before the entry form deadline. Purebred entry forms must also include a copy of the registration papers or the application for registration if not already registered. The ability to add pairs will be available online. (*see rule #11 regarding administrative fee). **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**
- e. **Dairy** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, January 6, 2027, at 5:00 PM. Entry forms must include a copy of the Grade ID papers, registration papers, or the application for registration if not already registered in .pdf format. (*see General Rule #11 regarding administrative fee). **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**
- f. **Poultry and rabbit** entry forms must be completed online at the link provided above on or before Wednesday, December 16, 2026, at 5:00 PM. (*see General Rule #11 regarding administrative fee). **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**

10. **ALL EXHIBITORS MUST download and read the 2027 OYLS rules. The acknowledgement form on the last page of the rules must be signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian and emailed in .pdf format to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com prior to entry deadline of the individual show (poultry, rabbits, dairy, market swine, Boer goat, lamb, market steer, beef breeding) in order to complete the entry. If this form is not received, the entry will be void and the exhibitor will not show this year.**

- 11. A \$10 administrative fee will be assessed per non-sale animal entry for beef breeding, dairy, Boer goats, lambs, poultry and rabbits. This fee will be collected upon entry online.
- 12. An exhibitor may enter and show six (6) animals or exhibits with a maximum of four (4) entries in one category. Exhibitor may enter only one animal per class. Exhibitor may initially weigh-in only one market steer or check-in only one market swine. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors), Dairy show exhibitors may show up to six (6) dairy animals. Dairy exhibitors exhibiting up to six (6) dairy animals will equal one (1) show project and be permitted to show any other species.
- 13. All animals must comply with State and/or Federal health regulations. All animals, *excluding* poultry and rabbits, must have a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian. All market swine and market steer projects, along with Boer goat and lamb projects that are to be sold in the OYLS sale must be checked in with their own copy of a certificate of veterinary inspection (i.e., each project must have their own copy if they are listed on one (1) health certificate with other projects). There will be a \$10.00 charge should OYLS have to make a copy of a health certificate.
- 14. All exhibitors shall be present when their animals are being checked in during the final check-in during the show week.
- 15. All animals must be approved by a sifting committee as to quality and breed characteristics, along with fitness and grooming, so as to be a credit to the show and sale.

16. Showmanship is mandatory for all species. Exhibitor must show his/her own animal, except by

permission of the committee, and a stand-in is not eligible for showmanship. **4-H Club/FFA Chapter projects are permitted to show in showmanship.**

17. 4-H Club/FFA Chapter projects: the same exhibitor showing the project must be the exhibitor showing in showmanship. If the exhibitor owns a project of the same species they are excluded from showmanship with the 4-H Club/FFA Chapter project.

18. Exhibitor must manage his/her animal to the satisfaction of the show committee. All rejected animals must be removed immediately from the grounds and will not be allowed to show or sell. Animals can be ejected at anytime from the show by the show committee.
19. All animals must have an exhibitor's identification sign. The sign must have the exhibitor's name, 4-H/FFA club name, animal name, and animal breed. Signs must be displayed by the end of the respective check-in day. (The assigned coop card will suffice for poultry and rabbits.)
20. Use of tranquilizers or other forms of tampering is prohibited. Any market animal will be condemned if there are signs of drug residue. Exhibitor will forfeit all monies and/or prizes from that animal and be banned from OYLS.
21. Exhibitor must keep his/her animals, stall space, and the barn in general, clean and neat as possible and must provide a suitable feed box. There will be a monetary penalty charged if stall space is not kept presentable and the possibility of not being eligible to show the following year. Stall space for all animals will be assigned by OYLS.
22. Show boxes and chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)
23. Exhibitors must dress appropriately while on the fairgrounds and must wear appropriate dress of the organization designated by the 4-H Leaders or FFA Advisors during the show and sale. A nice shirt (no short or long sleeve T-shirts or tank tops), along with long pants and closed-toed leather shoes are required for the show and sale.
24. Exhibitor will be responsible for the care of his/her animal until it is removed from the barn. Non-sale, milking dairy animals can, at the exhibitor's option, be removed after the dairy show. Additionally, cattle only (not the exhibitor) will be excused to go to another show with confirmation of entry into that other show and 30-day advance notification in writing to the livestock show committee. All other animals must remain until released by the committee.
25. There will be three showmanship divisions in each of the seven (7) shows (beef breeding, dairy, Boer goat, lamb, poultry, rabbit, market steer, and market swine). Participation is mandatory.
 - i) Junior 11 years old and younger as of 9/1/2026.
 - ii) Intermediate 12, 13 & 14 years old as of 9/1/2026.
 - iii) Senior 15 years old and older as of 9/1/2026.
26. Intermediate and senior exhibitors are required to attend the designated workday or to perform other work to be designated by the OYLS committee. Failure to follow this rule will result in a \$100 fine. Exhibitors are to bring your own cleaning utensil (rake, shovel, push broom). Exhibitors must sign in and sign out to receive credit for the workday.
27. A stamped, addressed, unsealed envelope with a thank you letter(s) to the buyer(s) of your animal must be turned into the Okeechobee County Extension Office on or before WEDNESDAY, April 7, 2027, at 5:00 pm or a \$100 fee will be deducted from the sale check. If your thank you letter(s)

was/were not previously turned into the Okeechobee County Extension Office, it/they must be brought to the check distribution in a stamped, addressed, unsealed envelope before you receive your sale check. If the thank you letter is not received by the check distribution date, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show next year.

28. Unless notified by the OYLS administrator that your buyer chose the donation option, a thank you plaque(s) MUST BE DELIVERED to the buyer(s) or buyer's representative prior to check distribution. A form will be available on the OYLS website, okeechobeeyouthlivestockshow.com, that the buyer(s) or buyer's representative MUST sign to indicate that they received the plaque(s). This form MUST be brought to the check distribution site and given to an OYLS board member or our administrator in exchange for your sale check.
29. If, at any time, the OYLS committee determines the exhibitor is not directly responsible for the care and welfare of their project or that anyone other than the exhibitor profits from the sale of the animal, the OYLS committee reserves the right to prohibit that exhibitor from participation in the show and sale.
30. No professional fitter will be allowed to assist or groom any animal or said animal will be disqualified from the show and sale. Only exhibitor's family or fellow 4-H/FFA members may be permitted.
31. **No tying animals to the chain link fences.**
32. Special barn rules may be posted.

33. **Unbecoming/inappropriate conduct on the part of the exhibitor, or anyone associated with the exhibitor, will, at the discretion of the OYLS committee, result in ejection of the exhibitor and forfeiture of any sale proceeds, add-ons, and show premiums and/or possible suspensions from future OYLS shows. This includes, but is not limited to, excessive profanity, rudeness, disrespect, bullying, and aggressive confrontations.**

34. Show management is in no way responsible for exhibits or any accidents that may occur.
35. Final interpretation and administration of all rules is vested in the livestock show committee and its decision is final. Any changes or amendments to these rules can only take place with 2/3 majority vote of the entire livestock show committee.
36. Appeals to any OYLS rule must be made in writing and delivered to the OYLS committee by mail, email, or in person. Appeals must be received 30 days prior to show check-in to be considered before the show. Any appeals received within 30 days of show check-in will not be guaranteed a ruling until after the show. Once appeals are voted on by committee, the decision is final.

----- SALE RULES -----

1. Sale order will be as follows: poultry, rabbits, Boer goats, lambs, dairy, beef breeding, market steers and market swine. The final sale order may be adjusted at the discretion of the OYLS committee.
2. Exhibitors may sell only one (1) animal per year.
3. All market steers and market swine shall be sold and slaughtered at a designated slaughterhouse.
4. If an animal is condemned at the show committee designated slaughterhouse, the buyer will be reimbursed for the buy-back amount at the expense of the exhibitor.
5. Dairy exhibitors may sell a calf, heifer or cow. Heifers over 20 months of age must be confirmed pregnant or milking. Heifers will be pregnancy checked the week of the sale.
6. Market steers will sell by Grand, Reserve, and the Okeechobee County Champion – followed by the Grand Champion Showman in each division.
7. Market Swine will sell by Grand, Reserve, then Division winners – followed by the Grand Champion Showman in each division.
8. Boer goats and lambs will sell by Grand and Reserve - followed by Grand Champion Showman in each division.
9. **Only graduating seniors are permitted to sell a poultry or rabbit exhibit.**
10. All no sales for poultry, rabbits, dairy, beef breeding, Boer goats and lambs must be announced before the animal leaves the sale ring. Exception to this will only be made by mutual consent of the buyer and seller.
11. The same exhibitor shall not sell an animal that has been previously sold by that exhibitor at the OYLS sale.
12. There will be an expense commission held out on all sales and add-ons to pay for show expenses.
13. **Transfer, I.D., certificates and registration papers will be picked up at check-in for beef breeding and dairy sale animals. All exhibitors MUST CHECK-IN with their respective species committee upon arrival show week. All poultry, rabbit, beef breeding, dairy, lamb, and boer goat exhibitors MUST TURN IN A SALE ENTRY FORM in to the OYLS show office by 5:00 p.m., Thursday, March 18th in order to sell their exhibit. The sale entry form can be found at the end of this rulebook. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to transfer documentation of the animal to the buyer, NOT OYLS. There will be a \$10.00 charge should OYLS have to make a copy of a health certificate.**
14. Exhibitors that sell their animals or receive add-ons will be paid only money that has been collected prior to the check distribution. All money collected after the check distribution will be paid on July 1, 2027. After July 1st, a serious effort will be made to collect money from the buyer(s) only. Exhibitors will be paid when the money is collected.
15. Animals which do not show (including showmanship), will not sell during the sale.
16. Bred animals must be confirmed as pregnant by an accredited veterinarian.
17. Exhibitors will not be eligible to receive add-ons through OYLS if an exhibitor's entry/animal does not make it through check-in, show and/or the live sale.

SPECIAL RULES FOR BEEF BREEDING SHOW



1. **All forms and registration papers for registered beef breeding animals must be submitted via email in .pdf format to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com by the entry form due date of Wednesday, January 6, 2027, at which time the exhibitor must be listed as the owner on the certificate. "Pending" and/or inconclusive registrations or ownership status will not be accepted.**

2. All animals registered with a breed association must compete in their respective breed specific division within the OYLS beef breeding show. If a breed specific division for a registered animal does not exist, the OYLS Beef Committee will assign the registered animal to the appropriate division as it sees fit and at its sole discretion. An exhibitor's failure to comply with this rule will result in an immediate disqualification of the animal and/or forfeiture of any awards and/or premiums.



3. **All beef breeding animals must have a visible numeric identification in the form of an ear flap tag, a freeze brand, or a fire brand. All beef breeding animals, except calves less than 90 days old who are nursing cows and not being shown as a standalone entry, are required to have at least one of the following at the final check in during show week: 840 RFID ear tag, NUES ear tag, OCV ear tags, or tattoo and/or brand corresponding to breed association issued registration papers.**

4. All unregistered beef breeding animals will be shown by weight.



5. **Registered beef breeding animals will be segregated into classes in accordance with their respective breed association rules. In the absence of breed association rule classes, registered beef breeding animals will be assigned to the classes listed on page 22 of this rulebook.**



6. **Classes requiring a pregnancy qualification, per breed association rules, and/or beef breeding animals showing in OYLS classes 15 and 16 must be certified pregnant by an accredited veterinarian with pregnancy status documented on an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by the diagnosing veterinarian.**

7. Large classes may be split.

8. If there are less than five (5) registered animals of the same breed and same gender, they will be added to the AOB (All Other Breed) class according to age.



9. **All bulls must be registered with a nationally recognized breed association and are subject to all applicable OYLS rules governing registered beef breeding animals.**

10. Bulls must be calved on or after January 1, 2025.

11. Heifers must be calved on or after January 1, 2024.

12. All bulls over 12 months old will be shown with a nose lead. A nose lead is optional and at the discretion of the exhibitor for beef breeding females and market steers.



13. Exhibitors will be granted one substitution animal, which must be continuously owned and in the possession of the exhibitor from December 1, 2026 through the day of the show. A substitution animal must be declared by Monday, February 8, 2027 at 5:00 pm. Okeechobee County Heifer affidavits are due at time of substitution if the substitution animal is to enter the Okeechobee County Heifer competition.



14. All beef breeding animals must be owned and in the possession of the exhibitor by December 1, 2026. Ownership and possession must be continuous from December 1, 2026 through the day of the show. This rule includes any animal used as substitute.

15. Calves shown with cows must be under 205 days old on day of show and the cow must be 39 months or younger.

16. Chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Show boxes will not be allowed in the barn, unless the OYLS Beef Committee authorizes beef exhibitors to have show boxes in designated areas within the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)

17. Water bucket(s) **MUST NOT** be left in cattle beds. They must be removed immediately after watering the animal.

18. All cattle must have and be shown with a suitable halter.

19. All cattle with horns must be tipped to no smaller than a quarter (i.e. .25 cent piece) in diameter.

20. Thursday, March 18, 2027, at 9:00 am, some beef breeding exhibitors may be required to walk their animal into the show ring to demonstrate control of their animal. This will be at the discretion of the committee.

21. There will be an overall Okeechobee County Heifer Champion. Each division will select a Grand and Reserve Okeechobee County champion at the end of their shows who will come back to compete for overall Okeechobee County Heifer Champion.

22. Okeechobee County heifers will be source verified by the Okeechobee Youth Livestock Show Committee prior to initial check-in. Okeechobee County heifer exhibits must be conceived and born on property that lies entirely within the geographical boundaries of Okeechobee County (property may not extend into other counties).

23. A signed affidavit for each heifer entered into the Okeechobee County show must be emailed in .pdf format to the OYLS administrator at okeechobeeyls@gmail.com by the entry form due date, Wednesday, January 6, 2027. The affidavit may be found at the end of the rulebook.

24. If an animal is entered into the Okeechobee County show and later deemed not an Okeechobee County animal, the exhibitor will be disqualified from the current year's show and sale and not permitted to show the following year.

25. Cow-calf pairs may not be used for beef breeding showmanship.

SPECIAL RULES FOR DAIRY SHOW



1. Registered and grade females with Grade I.D. papers may be shown, provided they are registered in the exhibitor's name. Registration/Grade ID papers or a copy of the certificate of application must be submitted with online entry via email in **.pdf format to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com**. Any entries with pending registration/grade ID papers need to submit updated copies of their papers before check-in. Registration/Grade ID papers/lease agreements must also be shown upon entering barn at check-in.
2. Exhibitors may enter dairy females of the following six (6) breeds (Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey and Milking Shorthorn).



3. Exhibitors may enter and show dairy animals that are leased to the exhibitor through the official Florida 4-H or FFA Dairy Lease Program. A copy of the official lease certificate must be submitted online at time of entry in **.pdf format to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com**. The rules of the official Florida 4-H or FFA Dairy Lease Program will apply to leased animals. Rules can be obtained by contacting the Lease Program Administrator, Dr. Chris DeCubellis (cdecube@ufl.edu).
4. No dairy animals may be entered or shown that are owned by more than one owner. This applies to owned or lease animals.
5. Exhibitors may enter and show up to six (6) Dairy animals. Dairy exhibitors exhibiting up to six (6) dairy animals will equal one (1) show project and be permitted to show any other species.
6. The Dairy Committee may allow for up to two (2) substitutions up until check-in.
7. All Class 2 or older dairy animals, including substitutions, must be owned or leased by December 1, 2026. All Class 1 dairy animals, including substitutions, must be owned or leased by entry deadline.
8. Cows three years old and older must have had at least one (1) calf prior to showing at OYLS.
9. Any animal that does not receive a blue ribbon will not be eligible to participate in a championship drive.
10. There will be a Junior, Senior and Overall Champion Bred-by-Exhibitor class. A bred-by animal is born to a dam that was owned by the exhibitor at the time of breeding. Proof of bred-by entry will be confirmed with registration paperwork at check-in. Leased animals are not eligible for bred-by classes.

*Dairy classes are listed on Page 22 of this rulebook.

SPECIAL RULES FOR MARKET STEER SHOW

1. Market steer entries are due Wednesday, September 9, 2026 by 5:00 pm. (this is your intent to show in the 2027 OYLS Market Steer Show.)
2. Market Steers will be weighed in on Thursday, September 17, 2026. There is no minimum or maximum weight requirement at initial weigh in. Market seers will be caught in a squeeze chute and tagged with an OYLS issued flap/840 RFID/tissue sampling unit combination tag. DNA will be collected on each market steer via the tissue sampling unit. Pictures will be taken of each market steer at initial weigh in.
3. OYLS ear tag and premise ID tags must not be intentionally removed from animal. All market steers are required to have the OYLS issued flap/840 RFID/tissue sampling unit combination tag the final check-in during show week. If the tag is damaged or lost, please contact a Market Steer/Beef Breeding Committee member for a replacement.
4. Market steers are required to have health certificates. EID number and OYLS ear tag number **MUST** be on the health certificates. Each market steer project must have a copy of their own health certificate (i.e., each project must have its own copy if they are listed on one (1) health certificate with other projects). There will be a \$10.00 charge should OYLS have to make a copy of a health certificate.
5. Market steers will be weighed once and one time only and must weigh **at least 1000 pounds** at show weigh-in on **March 17, 2027**.
6. Market steers will be classed by the show committee according to weight with no more than 8 per class.
7. All cattle must have and be shown with a suitable halter. A nose lead is optional and at the discretion of the exhibitor.
8. Chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Show boxes will not be allowed in the barn, unless the OYLS Beef Committee authorizes beef exhibitors to have show boxes in designated areas within the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)
9. Water buckets **MUST NOT** be left in cattle beds. They must be removed immediately after watering the animal.
10. Thursday, March 18, 2027 at 9:00 am, ALL MARKET STEER EXHIBITORS MUST walk their market steer into the show ring to demonstrate control of their market steer.
11. There will be an Okeechobee County Market Steer champion.
12. A completed affidavit for all market steers entered into the Okeechobee County portion of the market steer show must be emailed in .pdf format to the OYLS Administrator at okeechobeeyls@gmail.com prior to entry deadline of Wednesday, September 9th, at 5:00 pm. The affidavit may be found at end of the rulebook. Animals competing in the Okeechobee County portion of the market steer show must be conceived and born on property that lies entirely within the geographical boundaries of Okeechobee County (property may not extend into other counties).
13. If an animal is entered into the Okeechobee County show and later deemed not an Okeechobee County animal, the exhibitor will be disqualified from the current year's show and sale and not permitted to show the following year.

* Note – In vitro fertilization (IVF) animals must have been fertilized within the geographical boundaries of Okeechobee County.

SPECIAL RULES FOR MARKET SWINE SHOW

1. All Market swine must be of a recognized domestic breed.
2. All entries must be limited to market barrows or open gilts. Entries must be completed online by November 25, 2026.
3. Market swine exhibitors must declare their entry on Wednesday, December 2, 2026, between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., by picking up your ear tag. **Ear tag pick up is mandatory on this day, exhibitor need not be present (i.e., a parent/guardian, sibling, etc., may pick up ear tag on behalf of exhibitor).** Pick up will be at the OHS (Okeechobee High School) Ag Barn. Do not bring your animal. (If an exhibitor does not have the means to tag their animal, contact an OYLS market swine committee member, your County 4-H Extension Agent or your FFA Advisor). **If the ear tag is not picked up on this day and time your entry will be disqualified.** Tag your market swine, in either ear, with the tag # on the top of the ear. You should be able to view the tag number when looking down at the pig.
4. **After you pick up your OYLS issued ear tag, and have tagged your market swine project,** take three (3) color pictures. One (1) color picture of the exhibitor and their market swine, and one (1) color picture of the market swine with the ear tag # clearly visible, and one (1) color picture from the front of the market swine with face and both ears visible. Email your color pictures to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com with your exhibitor first and last name and corresponding market swine ear tag # in the subject line no later than December 17, 2026.
5. OYLS ear tag and premise ID tags must not be intentionally removed from animal. **If your market swine loses any of its tag(s) (OYLS or RFID), it is the exhibitor's responsibility to secure a new tag from an OYLS market swine committee member (OYLS tag) or veterinarian (RFID tag) and have the animal retagged prior to unloading at OYLS weigh in.**
6. Market swine must weigh a minimum of 230 pounds and a maximum of 310 pounds at weigh-in on Tuesday, March 16, 2027.
7. During check-in/weigh-in at the show, drivers are to remain in vehicle and pull forward as soon as the animal is unloaded. Exhibitors are responsible for the unloading of their animals. OYLS will not assume liability for any injury to market swine. OYLS will take the animal to the scale once it's unloaded. Exhibitors are encouraged to take their market swine from the scale to their pen.
8. Market swine will be allowed to weigh one time only at the weigh-in. In case an animal does not meet weight requirement, exhibitor may request the scales be zeroed and re-weighed immediately. The request must be made before the animal leaves the scales, and the animal cannot be removed from the scale area before being re-weighed.
9. By 3:00 pm the day of show check-in, if animal has not yet been attended to, exhibitor and/or parent will be contacted. If issue is not resolved in a timely manner, exhibitor will be disqualified, and the animal will then become the possession of OYLS.
10. All market swine exhibitors must provide a self watering device in the pen at all times. Jugs will not be permitted to be left on pipes. Waterers must remain in the pens until Sunday. Waterers will be allowed to be picked up starting at 8:00 am on Sunday morning. Waterers not picked up by the end of the workday are not the responsibility of OYLS. Any exhibitor who removes a

waterer from their pen prior to Sunday morning will be subject to a \$500 fine.

11. Cedar shavings and/or small flake shaving will not be permitted.
12. All market swine must have an exhibitor's identification sign. The sign must have the exhibitor's name, 4-H/FFA club name, animal name and animal breed. Signs must be displayed by the end of the respective check-in day.
13. Pens will be checked twice daily for cleanliness, water and signage. If pens are found not up to the standard of OYLS, exhibitors will be warned at the time of check. Warning will be communicated by marking the pen, email and phone call. If the exhibitor's pen is found not up to the standard on any check after warning, exhibitor will be fined \$200 per check. Cleanliness will be at the discretion of the OYLS committee.
14. Pens will be pre-assigned by OYLS, and grouped together by 4-H Club/FFA Chapter approximately 2-3 weeks prior to check in. A list will be emailed to exhibitors. Exhibitors will have five (5) days to respond with any requests to be moved (siblings, family, etc.). After the five (5) days, assignments will not be changed. On Sunday, March 14th or Monday, March 15th from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM, exhibitors will be allowed to come in and set their pens up (signs, water, etc).
15. Market swine must be controlled by the exhibitor at all times using the proper tools. Failure to comply will result in being banned from showing in OYLS for one (1) year.
16. Market swine are required to have health certificates. EID number and OYLS ear tag number MUST be on the health certificates. Each market swine project must have a copy of their own health certificate (i.e., each project must have their own copy if they are listed on one (1) health certificate with other projects). There will be a \$10.00 charge should OYLS have to make a copy of a health certificate.
17. Show boxes and chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)
18. Buyer's thank you letter(s) must be in a stamped, addressed, unsealed envelope. The thank you letter(s) to the buyer(s) of your animal must be turned in to the Okeechobee County Extension Office on or before WEDNESDAY, April 7, 2027, at 5:00 pm or a \$100 fee will be deducted from the sale check. If your thank you letter(s) was/were not previously turned into the Okeechobee County Extension Office, it/they must be brought to the check distribution in a stamped, addressed, unsealed envelope before you receive your sale check. If the thank you letter is not received by the check distribution date, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show next year. (see General Rules #27)

SPECIAL RULES FOR POULTRY SHOW

1. As of show day, all poultry exhibits must be at least 180 days old.
2. All poultry exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor or participant (Cloverbud).
3. A color photo of exhibitor holding animal must be submitted to the OYLS administrator at okeechobeeyls@gmail.com at the time of entry. **(excludes Cloverbuds)**
4. No substitutions of animals within 30 days of check-in for exhibitors. (Cloverbuds will be allowed substitutions until check-in.)
5. Cloverbuds are only permitted to exhibit one (1) poultry.
6. If there are more than five (5) animals of the same breed and sex entered a class will be made. If there are not enough animals to make a class for the breed, the poultry will be shown in an open class with all other poultry of like sex.
7. Poultry entries will be limited to chickens, ducks and turkeys.
8. All poultry (excluding ducks) will be bled and checked for disease at check-in. **POULTRY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THEY ARE IN HEALTHY CONDITION.** Health certificates are not required. State Health Inspectors will be onsite checking each exhibit at check-in.
9. The OYLS committee may decline any entries they feel should not be shown.
10. It is suggested you dust your bird for mites with 5% Sevin or 5% Bug-Be-Gone prior to check-in day.
11. There will be NO medicating of poultry. If illness appears during the course of the show, the poultry must be removed from the premises.
12. Pairs equal two entries. There will be no animals shown or penned as pairs.
13. Exhibitors are responsible for supplying dividers between pens of animals if preferred, OYLS is not responsible.
14. Storage under pens is prohibited. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls.
15. Shavings nor hay will not be permitted in pens.
16. Feeders and waterers must be secured to the side of the pen.
17. Ducks are permitted to have a water bowl in pen.
18. Animals not cared for properly by cleaning pens, feeding and watering will be excused at the discretion of the OYLS committee.
19. There will be limited access to the small animal barn during judging of animals.
20. Poultry will be released immediately following the awards ceremony on the day of the show **and** after mandatory clean-up for all Intermediate and Senior exhibitors.
21. **Cloverbuds will be released at the conclusion of their show, and after their photos have been taken. Your pen and show area must be clean upon departure.**

SPECIAL RULES FOR RABBIT SHOW

1. As of show day, all rabbit exhibits must be at least 180 days old.
2. All rabbits must be owned by the exhibitor or participant (Cloverbud).
3. A color photo of exhibitor holding animal must be submitted to the OYLS administrator at okeechobeeyls@gmail.com at the time of entry. **(excludes Cloverbuds)**
4. State Health Inspectors will be at check-in. All rabbits will be checked for disease at check-in. Automatic disqualifications include: runny eyes or nose, matted and heavily soiled fur below the tail, ear or fur mites, and/or excessively long nails. **RABBITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THEY ARE IN HEALTHY CONDITION.** Health certificates are not required.
5. The OYLS committee may decline any entries they feel should not be shown.
6. If illness appears during the course of the show, the rabbit must be removed from the premises.
7. No substitutions of animals within 30 days of check-in for exhibitors. (Cloverbuds will be allowed substitutions until check-in).
8. Cloverbuds are only permitted to exhibit one (1) rabbit.
9. If there are more than five (5) animals of the same breed and sex entered a class will be made. If there are not enough animals to make a class for the breed, the rabbit will be shown in an open class with all other does or bucks.
10. Exhibitors are responsible for supplying dividers between pens of animals if preferred. OYLS is not responsible.
11. There will be limited access to the small animal barn during judging of animals.
12. Storage under pens is prohibited. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls.
13. Shavings nor hay will not be permitted in pens.
14. Feeders and waterers must be secured to the side of the pen.
15. Animals not cared for properly by cleaning pens, feeding and watering will be excused at the discretion of the OYLS committee.
16. Rabbits will be released immediately following the awards ceremony on the day of the show **and** after the mandatory clean-up for all Intermediate and Senior Exhibitors.
17. **Cloverbuds will be released at the conclusion of their show, and after their photos have been taken. Your pen and show area must be clean upon departure.**

SPECIAL RULES FOR BOER GOAT SHOW

1. There will be a wether and a breeding doe show.
2. Dairy goats are not permitted to show.
3. Eligibility of Animal: Limited to Boer goats. Each exhibitor will be responsible for obtaining their own goat.
4. **Exhibitors must email one color photo of exhibitor with goat to okeechobeeyls@gmail.com and one color photo of the scrapies tag. The scrapies tag must be clearly visible in the picture submission. Scrapies tag information must be submitted at time of registration.**
5. There will be no initial weigh-in.
6. FINAL WEIGH-IN & ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY: Goats will be weighed on certified scales and this will be the official weight. Wethers will be placed in class based on weight. Breeding Does will be placed in classes at the discretion of the OYLS Goat Committee. Animals not displaying a scrapies tag will not be permitted to be unloaded.
7. SHOWING: All boer goats must be trained for show and are to be controlled by the exhibitor.
8. All Boer goats must be shown in their natural confirmation and structure without alterations or modification, except for the grooming and treatment of the wool and trimming of the hooves.
9. Boer goats are to be kept clean and in show condition until official release time.
10. Show boxes and chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)

NOTE: ALL PENS MUST BE CLEANED DAILY. EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO CLEAN GROOMING AREAS AFTER GROOMING. A \$25 PENALTY PER ANIMAL WILL BE ASSESSED IF THE PEN IS NOT PROPERLY CLEANED DAILY OR EXHIBITOR DOES NOT CLEAN GROOMING AREA AFTER GROOMING.



SPECIAL RULES FOR LAMB SHOW

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1. Limited to lambs (wethers only). Each exhibitor will be responsible for obtaining their own Lambs.
2. A minimum of fifteen (15) lambs entered to have a show.
3. Exhibitors must email one color photo of exhibitor with lamb to okeechobeevls@gmail.com and one color photo of the scrapies tag. The scrapies tag must be clearly visible in the picture submission. Scrapies tag information must be submitted at time of registration.
4. There will be no initial weigh-in.
5. Animals not displaying a scrapies tag at final check-in/weigh-in will not be permitted to be unloaded.
6. Lambs will be weighed on certified scales, and this will be the official weight. Lambs will be placed in class based on weight.
7. All lambs must be trained for show and are to be controlled by the exhibitor. Animals that cannot be handled properly will be asked to be haltered or be disqualified.
8. All lambs must be shown in their natural confirmation and structure without alterations or modification, except for the grooming and treatment of the wool and trimming of the hooves.
9. Lambs are to be kept clean and in show condition until official release time.
10. Show boxes and chairs will not be allowed in the barn. Space will be provided in the horse barn stalls. (Excluding dairy show exhibitors)

NOTE: ALL PENS MUST BE CLEANED DAILY. EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO CLEAN GROOMING AREAS AFTER GROOMING. A \$25 PENALTY PER ANIMAL WILL BE ASSESSED IF THE PEN IS NOT PROPERLY CLEANED DAILY OR EXHIBITOR DOES NOT CLEAN GROOMING AREA AFTER GROOMING.

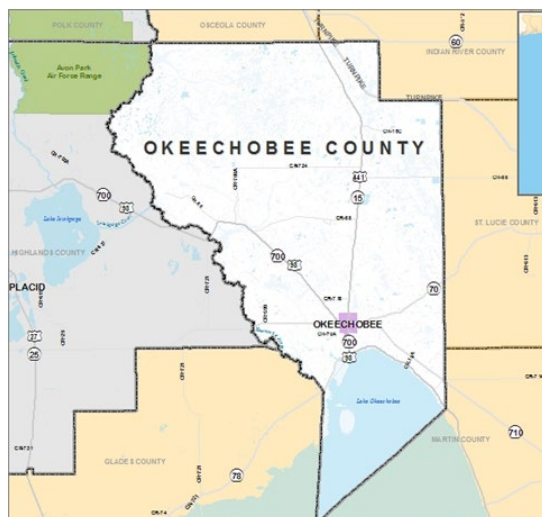

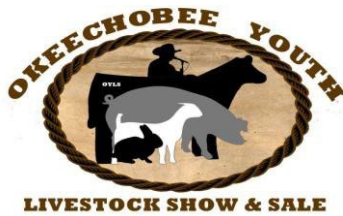
